

Nomination and Selection Process

Who may nominate for the Belk Scholarship?

- School counselors, principals/heads of school, college access program leadership.
- The Davidson Admission Committee may also nominate based on the strength of a student's application for admission.

Important Dates and Deadlines

- November 1: Nomination deadline (submit nomination form at admission.davidson.edu/ belknomination).
- November 15: Application deadline for all Belk nominees (application for admission, recommendations, and all required supporting documents; no supplements required).

PLEASE NOTE: Application by this deadline does not necessarily imply a commitment to Early Decision.

- Early February: Semi-finalist notification and interviews.
- Mid-February: Finalist notification.
- Mid-March: Belk Finalist Events, including interviews and activities designed to provide a fuller sense of the Davidson community.
- By April 1: Belk Scholarship outcomes announced.

JOHN MONTGOMERY BELK'43 Leadership and Vision

John M. Belk, Davidson Class of 1943, continued a family tradition that began with the earliest Belk family graduates in 1847. At Davidson, he earned a record of leadership and accomplishment that foreshadowed his extraordinary career and commitment to service. After serving in WWII and the Korean War and spending time as an officer of the United Nations Civil Assistance Commission, John Belk returned to the family business in 1952, leading it to become one of the nation's largest and most profitable retailers. John Belk dedicated himself to his community and, as mayor of Charlotte for four terms (1969 to 1977), he positioned the city to become the nation's second largest banking center and one of the country's fastest growing cities. In 2000, John Belk made a historic gift to endow the John M. Belk flagship scholarship program at Davidson.

As President and Board Chair of the John M. Belk Endowment, MC Belk Pilon continues her late father's legacy of leadership and vision. She and her team are committed to increasing access to and completion of post-secondary education in order to give all the chance at long-term, family-sustaining careers. MC also serves the community on boards that champion education access, including myFutureNC, Inc; The Belk Foundation; College Advising Corps; Good Friends, Greater Enrichment; the Fletcher School; and Charlotte Country Day School. In 2016, MC was awarded the Roanoke College Medal, the highest honor accorded a graduate; and in 2020, received the I.E. Ready Award, the highest honor bestowed by the State Board of Community Colleges.
